DISCIPLE OF JESUS

- He was a disciple of John the Baptist
 - While it's possible one of the other twelve disciples may have followed John the Baptist, the only one mentioned by name is Andrew (John 1:35-40)
- He was the first of the disciples to bring others to Jesus
 - Upon discovering that Jesus was the Messiah, Andrew immediately went to tell Peter about Him (John 1: 40-42)
- He was one of few disciples to hear about the signs of the end
 - Andrew was listed with Peter, James, and John as being one of the few disciples to hear what Jesus had to say about the end times (Mark 13:3)
- Demonstrated willingness and quick-thinking during the feeding of the 5000
 - Though the disciples couldn't see how they could provide food for 5,000 people, Andrew took the initiative to find food like Jesus had asked (John 6:7-9)
 - He brought Jesus a boy who had packed a lunch of five barley loaves and two fish (John 6:9), and with that, Jesus performed an amazing miracle

AFTER JESUS' ASCENSION

- His role as a follower shifted to one of a leader
- Andrew was involved in:
 - Choosing someone to replace Judas Iscariot as the twelfth disciple (Acts 1:13)
